2019: a banner year

The Chamber of Gadsden & Etowah County's mission is to be a catalyst for economic growth in Etowah County by serving member businesses through advocacy, education and community partnerships. We are pleased to share with you the following achievements in 2019 aligned with our current strategic drivers.



business-driven talent development

- Expanded Etowah Workforce Academy: a day-long program that provided over 400 area educators an immersion in manufacturing and healthcare jobs with major staffing gaps, and provided a professional development credit incentive for completion.
- Partnered to produce regional Worlds of Work and helped grow to include all 8th grade students throughout Etowah County, including private schools.
- The Inaugural Etowah County Community Spring Job Fair was held in May. More than 90 employers participated, and more than 500 job seekers attended – many of which were high school seniors. Participant surveys indicated a high level of satisfaction, hires made and desire to participate again next year.



partnering with public education

- In the 2019-2020 school year, all 2nd grade classrooms received the Libby Liberty Super Citizen Program a program designed to teach crucial lessons in civics, character, financial literacy, careers and social studies. The program has been a part of Etowah County Schools for several years and with great results.
- Graduated 21 high school juniors from The Chamber's Student Leadership program..
- The Chamber partnered with leaders of the Lambda Eta Omega chapter of the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority and Gadsden City Schools to provide a 6-week soft-skills training in all 6th grade classrooms, teaching students fundamentals like proper dining etiquette, handshakes and introductions and more.





existing business growth & retention

- •Produced the inaugural Etowah County Restaurant Week, with fixed menus from participating restaurants at no cost to the restaurants to participate.
- The Rise & Shine Economic Development Speaker Series had six sessions in 2019. They featured speakers from across Etowah County and the state of Alabama to discuss economic development in our area.
- Produced annual Etowah Small Business of the Year Awards
- Began a year-long shop local campaign known as "Driving the Community", a video series which features members of our communities.
- Launched quarterly "What Keeps you up at Night?" Small Business Roundtables and quarterly Chamber "Pop-Ups" throughout the county.



entrepreneurship, incubation & innovation

- Established Building a Better Etowah County as a 501(c)3 foundation to support the efforts of education, business incubation and economic growth
- Deployed the inaugural Young Entrepreneur Fair to all 5th grade classrooms, and 9 classrooms throughout all systems elected to participate in the program and curriculum.
- Ascend Coworking Lab is being established by The Chamber in Downtown Gadsden and is slated to being accepting contracts soon!
- Partnered to produce TechStars Startup Weekend powered by Google.
